0	MOBILE X-RAY UNIT – ONE required Used to take X-rays of patients in the departments.	\$50,000
	HEATING FOOD CARTS - Enables food to be served hot to patients in the departments	\$37,500
	RESPIRATORS FOR ADULTS – TWENTY FIVE required Used to support patients who are unable to breath on their own.	\$28,000
0	RESPIRATORS FOR CHILDREN – TEN required Used to support children who are unable to breath on their own.	\$22,500
0	BLADDER SCAN - A portable bed side ultrasound used to scan the amount of urine in the bladder for diagnosing urine retention and the need for a urinary catheter. Urinary retention is a common problem amongst the elderly patients.	\$22,000
0	FULLY EQUIPPED CRASH CART – FOUR required With all acute care emergency equipment, including defibrillator and pulse oximeter. To rush emergency aid in critical care situations.	\$15,000
()	HEART MONITORS – FOUR required Attached to the critical care patient, this machine keeps moment-to-moment track of all essential heart functions and alerts doctors and nurses to any sudden change in vital heart functioning, especially during weaning from respirators.	\$12,000
()	<u>DEFIBRILLATORS</u> – THREE required Electric-shock, life-saving apparatus for victims of heart attacks. Used for patients in intensive care.	\$10,000
	COUGH ASSIST MACHINE - A crucial ventilator assist therapy for patients in the Chronic Respiratory Care Department	\$9,000
()	WHEELCHAIR CUSHIONS - \$ 200 per pillow \$7000 to equip an entire department Needed to prevent pressure sores in geriatric patients who are confined to wheelchairs. Pressure sores are a leading cause of morbidity and mortality amongst the geriatric patients.	\$7,000
	CUSTOM DESIGNED CHILDREN'S BEDS WITH SPECIAL MATTRESS For the children in the Children's Chronic Respiratory Unit.	\$6,000
	<u>STATE-OF-THE-ART BEDS</u> – THIRTY required For rehabilitation and acute care patients, with attachments for respirator apparatus, oxygenators and other vital life-saving devices.	\$6,000
	STANDARD ELECTRO-CARDIOGRAPHS (ECG) – FOUR required A regular "workhorse" for day-to-day use in heart examination.	\$6,000



0	SPECIAL NEED WHEELCHAIRS FOR CHILDREN Tailor made for handicapped children on respirators with special needs	\$5,000
	COMMERCIAL DISHWASHER	\$5,000
0	MOBILE VITAL SIGNS MONITOR – SIX required Measures blood pressure (non-invasive), oxygen saturation, pulse rate and body temperature. Used for very ill patients who are not in an intensive care bed.	\$3,500
0	SCALE FOR HOIST - To weight patients in their beds. This is most important as many patients cannot get out of their beds.	\$3,750
0	FLOOR CLEANING MACHINES	\$3,750
()	CO2 LEVEL METER (Capnograph) Device to measure Carbon Dioxide level of patients on respirators, so as to make sure that the ventilation is effective.	\$3,750
()	SPECIAL NEED WHEELCHAIR – TWENTY required For handicapped patients with special needs – e.g. patients with a missing limb.	\$3,000
	MONITOR FOR GENERAL PARAMETER - Measures the cardiac rhythm and amount of oxygen and temperature in the blood continuously.	\$2,500
()	<u>WHEELCHAIR SCALE (foldable ramp</u>) - Enables staff to weigh a patient who is in a_wheelchair and can't stand	\$2,500
()	PULSE OXIMETERS – TWENTY required Important diagnostic device for patients with breathing and circulatory problems. It measures the amount of oxygen in the blood.	\$1,800
()	SPECIAL MATTRESSES – SIXTY required Used for acute care and other patients requiring special care who are at high risk of developing pressure sores.	\$1.500
()	PATIENTS' CHAIRS - Reclining chairs for patients to sit on, so that they are not always in bed	\$750
	DINING ROOM TABLES - For patients to enjoy their meals	\$625
